## Press Release

Gallatin County COVID-19 Update

As of Sunday, May 3, 2020, at 12 p.m. Gallatin County has no new confirmed cases of COVID-19, for a cumulative total of 146. There are zero confirmed active cases. There have been a total of 145 people recovered. One person has died from COVID-19 complications.

The Gallatin City-County Health Department calculates the **recovered case number** as the number of total cases minus any active cases, current hospitalizations and deaths.

This dashboard will be updated by 12 p.m. each day. Due to an issue with the dashboard this weekend, we are unable to provide an updated total of the number of people tested in Gallatin County. As of April 30, there had been 2,255 people tested.
